ORANGE RESUMES BIG EAST PLAY AT LOUISVILLE

The SU men's soccer team returns to BIG EAST Conference action on Saturday, Oct. 20 when it takes on #25 Louisville at Cardinal Park. The Orange wrapped up an undefeated non-conference season on Wednesday with a 1-1 draw at Hartwick. The remainder of its schedule features games against conference division rivals beginning with the Cardinals. The match is SU's third against a ranked opponent this season.

ABOUT THE CARDINALS

Second-year head coach Ken Lolla has seen his team improve greatly since last season. After posting a 5-10-3 overall mark in 2006, Lolla has guided Louisville to an 8-4-1 record this season, including a 4-2-1 conference mark. The Cardinals have outscored their opponents, 20-9, on the year and 11-2 in the second halves of matches. Louisville has allowed just three goals to conference opponents and leads the league in goals-against average during BIG EAST play at 0.48. The Cardinals have five shutouts in seven conference matches to date. Louisville knocked off Cincinnati, 1-0, in their most recent outing, on Oct. 17, to claim a share of the lead in the Red Division with 13 points.

Marco Terminesi and Gerardo Chavez both own double-digit point totals for the Cardinals. Terminesi leads the club in goals (6) and points (14). Chavez has 10 points on three goals and a team-best four assists. Ten members of the Louisville roster have goals this year. Goalkeeper David Simolike holds a 0.73 goals-against average, including a league-best 0.48 mark in conference play. Four of his shutouts this year have come in conference games.

THE SYRACUSE-LOUISVILLE SERIES

The Orange and Cardinals have played twice since Louisville joined the BIG EAST Conference prior to the 2005 campaign. Both teams have posted victories on the other's home field. The two teams squared off for the first time in 2005 with the Orange winning by the score of 2-1 in two overtimes at Cardinal Park. The Cardinals returned the favor with a 4-0 victory in 2006 at the SU Soccer Stadium.

THE ORANGE IN OVERTIME

Since 1981, Syracuse is 29-37-55 (.467) when the game goes more than 90 minutes. In single-overtime games, the Orange is 24-28 (.462), while its double-overtime mark is 4-9-55. The longest game in school history was a 1-0 victory in four extra periods against Boston College in the 1982 BIG EAST championship game. Syracuse was 2-2-1 in extra-session games in 2006 and is 0-1-4 in 2007.

LAST TIME VERSUS LOUISVILLE

Louisville 4, Syracuse 0 (10/1/06)

Syracuse dominated the pace of play versus Louisville, but lost to the Cardinals, 4-0, at the SU Soccer Stadium. The Orange out-shot Louisville, 20-11, and generated the majority of the game's scoring chances, but the Cardinals were more efficient converting theirs into goals, scoring twice in each half to post the victory.

The Orange took the first four shots of the contest, but Louisville was the team that found the back of the net first, scoring on its first shot of the game. David Guzman served a ball from the left side into the box and Anthony Celebre raced in from the right and headed it home at 17:58 to put Louisville in front, 1-0. Guzman gave the Cardinals a two-goal advantage in the 36th minute when he beat an Orange defender and delivered a left-footed strike past SU keeper Robert Cavicchia.

SU came out firing at the start of the second half, recording three scoring chances inside the 18 in the first 10 minutes of the period. Cardinals' keeper Trae Manny was up to the task. He made saves on each chance, including a pair of acrobatic stops.

Louisville's Gerard Voutier sealed the win for the Cardinals scoring twice after halftime, once at 75:44 and again at 87:46 to close the scoring.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

With its 1-1 draw at Hartwick on Oct. 17, the Orange posted an undefeated record in non-conference games for the second consecutive season. SU went 3-0-4 in non-league matches and is 8-0-4 in non-conference games the last two years. The Orange owns a 13-game, non-conference winning streak. It's last non-BIG EAST loss was to Oneonta in 2005. SU's undefeated non-conference record in 2006 represented the first time since BIG EAST regular-season competition began in 1985 that SU maneuvered through its non-league slate without a loss. **Syracuse is the only BIG EAST team not to lose a non-conference game during the last two seasons.**

In the last eight seasons, the Orange has finished at .500 or better in non-conference matches seven times. The only year it didn't was in 2004 when SU was 2-5 in non-league encounters. Since the beginning of the 2005 campaign, the Orange is 12-1-7 in non-BIG EAST clashes.

WOODRUFF JOINING RARE COMPANY

Sophomore forward **Hansen Woodruff (Stuart, Fla.)** is enjoying the finest offensive season of any SU player the last five years. He notched his team-leading eighth goal of the season on a penalty kick at Hartwick to increase his scoring total to 20 points (8g, 4a). Woodruff is the first player since Jarett Park in 2002 to reach the 20-point plateau and his goals total is the most since Park had eight that same season. Woodruff is tied for third in the conference in scoring and is also third in goals.

WOODRUFF EQUALS WINS

The Orange tends to come out on the winning end of games when sophomore forward **Hansen Woodruff (Stuart, Fla.)** finds the back of the net. During his first two seasons, Woodruff has scored in 14 matches and SU is 8-3-3 in those contests. This season the Orange is 4-1-2 when he finds the scoring column with victories against Penn State, Seton Hall, Fordham and Pittsburgh. SU's only loss this year when Woodruff had a goal was at Providence. The Orange also tied James Madison at the Mayor's Cup on a Woodruff tally, as well as Hartwick.

Woodruff is averaging 0.52 goals per game through his first 29 matches, which is on pace to rank second on the school's career goals per game chart (min. 30 games). Woodruff also has 36 career points, good for an average of 1.24 points per contest. That current clip would place him fourth on that SU ledger (min. 30 games). Almost half of his 15 goals have been game-winners (6). His eight tallies is one more than his 2006 season total (7) recorded in 16 matches.

PEETOOM A FINALIST FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Syracuse senior defender **Brad Peetoom** (Abbotsford, British Columbia) was selected on Wednesday, Oct. 17 as one of 10 finalists nationwide for the first Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for men's soccer. The award will be presented to an NCAA Division I men's senior soccer player who excels both on and off the field. Candidates were selected based on personal qualities that define a complete student-athlete. While the on-the-field performance during their collegiate careers is a factor in determining the eventual winner, their personal character and off-the-field achievements in the classroom and community are major areas of focus.

The winner will be announced during the NCAA College Cup scheduled for Dec. 14-16 in Cary, N.C. The Lowe's Senior All-America Team will also be recognized at that time.

PEREVEGYENCEV NAMED TO WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Sophomore forward **Tom Perevegyencev** (Budapest, Hungary) was selected to the BIG EAST Men's Soccer Weekly Honor Roll on Monday, Oct. 15. Perevegyencev tallied the first game-winning goal of his career to lift the Orange to a 1-0 victory against Cincinnati Saturday, Oct. 13. Perevegyencev found the back of the net with 1:38 left in the second half to snap a scoreless tie. The play started when he gathered a pass in the far right corner and darted toward the goal. He eluded two Cincinnati defenders and fired a shot inside the far post from 12 yards out to give SU the win.

It was the fourth goal of the year for Perevegyencev, who made his second career start in the contest. Perevegyencev ranks second on the team in scoring (10 points), goals (4) and is tied for second on the squad with two assists. The goal was his second in two games (Perevegyencev also had SU's lone tally at Rutgers on Oct. 7), marking the first time in his career he notched a goal in back-to-back outings.

CAVICCHIA ECLIPSES 200 SAVES

Junior keeper **Robert Cavicchia** (North York, Ontario) stopped five shots in SU's win against Cincinnati to go over the 200 career saves mark. He is the sixth goalkeeper in school history to reach the 200-saves plateau. Cavicchia's biggest stop of the night came in the 56th minute after Kenny Anaba slipped through the SU backline. Anaba broke free and rifled a shot ticketed for the lower left 90, but Cavicchia dove and snared it to keep the match scoreless.

With the shutout, Cavicchia took over sole possession of sixth place on SU's all-time shutout list (13), and the victory was the 17th of his career, elevating him into a tie with Steve Pollnow for sixth on that Orange career ledger. Cavicchia has made at least five saves in a game eight times this year. He has 58 stops on the season and 205 for his career.

AYE AYE CAPTAIN!

For the second consecutive season, **Brad Peetoom** (Abbotsford, British Columbia) has been elected team captain by his peers. In 2006, Peetoom and the departed Richard Asante shared those duties. Peetoom is SU's only captain in 2007. He was named the team's Defensive MVP in his first three seasons with the Orange and has started all 62 matches he has appeared in during his career. He has been a part of 18 shutouts and has 12 career points (5g, 2a). Peetoom was SU's leading scorer in 2004 (8 pts).

SU LOVES NEW YORK

Since the start of the 1999 season, SU boasts a 28-17-8 (.604) mark against teams located in the State of New York. The Orange went 4-0-1 against New York foes in 2006, posting wins against Niagara, Albany, Binghamton, Hartwick and a draw at St. John's. SU is 1-0-2 against Empire State teams in 2007. Syracuse has posted at least a .500 record versus New York schools in seven of the last eight years. The only year it didn't was in 2004 when it went 2-5 against New York opponents.

CHAMNEY ADJUSTING WELL TO NEW ROLE

Sophomore **Brien Chamney** (Oakville, Ontario) has taken to his new position of outside back. He started as the fourth member of SU's backline for the first time on Oct. 7 at Rutgers. He made his second straight start at the position in the Cincinnati contest on Oct. 13 and played all 90 minutes in that spot to help the Orange to its fifth shutout of the season. Chamney moved to outside back after an injury to senior starter **James Goodwin** (Merrimack, N.H.). For the season, Chamney has started all 13 games. He started the first 10 in the midfield.

QUICK STRIKE

Syracuse's match at Rutgers started with a bang as the two teams combined to score the fastest consecutive goals by opposing teams in Orange history. The clubs traded tallies 14 seconds apart in the 29th minute. After a Syracuse turnover in the midfield, Rutgers' Adam Sternberger launched a 30-yard shot that found its target to put the Scarlet Knights in front, 1-0, at 28:08. The Orange responded on the ensuing kickoff as sophomore **Tom Perevegyencev** (Budapest, Hungary) lofted a shot over the head of keeper Matt VanOekel at the 28:22 mark to tie the score. Sophomore **Luis Martinez** (Morristown, N.J.) ignited the action, playing the ball up to Perevegyencev for the equalizer. The back-to-back goals eclipsed the previous school record for fastest goals by both teams by one second. In 2003, SU's Kirk Johnson and St. Bonaventure's Ryan Mahoney scored 15 seconds apart in the second half of a 2-2 draw.

ROWLEY RETURNS

Junior forward **Pete Rowley** (Reading, Pa.) saw his first action of the 2007 season at Rutgers on Oct. 7. Rowley suffered a knee injury during spring practice and missed SU's first 10 games. Rowley entered the game in the first half and played 26 minutes. He also saw action against Cincinnati. For his career, Rowley has 10 goals and three assists for a total of 23 points.

ORANGE TO MAKE FIRST NATIONAL TV APPEARANCE

The Orange men's soccer team will make its first national TV appearance in school history on Wednesday, Oct. 31 when it faces St. John's at home at 7:00 p.m. in a match that will air live on ESPNU. The game is one of two BIG EAST soccer contests ESPNU will televise this fall. The Rutgers-St. John's game on Oct. 24 will also be carried by the network.

ORANGE TOPS 1,000 IN ATTENDANCE VERSUS WEST VIRGINIA

A crowd of 1,010 fans turned out for the Orange's home showdown with No. 5 West Virginia on Sept. 23. It was the largest home crowd of the season and the sixth-biggest home gathering for the Orange since the SU Soccer Stadium opened in 1996. The Orange generated two home crowds of more than 1,000 spectators in 2006 (vs. Niagara and Connecticut).

GERVAIS NAMED USL FIRST-TEAM ALL-STAR FOR SIXTH TIME

Former Orange men's soccer star and current member of the United Soccer League's (USL) Montreal Impact **Gabriel Gervais** has been selected to the 2007 All-USL First Team. It was Gervais' sixth consecutive first-team nod. Gervais is the fifth player in the history of the league to be named all-league six times in his career and is the first to do so in consecutive seasons. The Impact finished third in the First Division standings (14-6-8) and won the Voyageurs Cup, which is given to the top Canadian team in the league, for the sixth consecutive year. Gervais has also been selected as a finalist for Defender of the Year for the fifth straight time. He won the award in 2003, 2004 and 2006.

At Syracuse, Gervais was a two-time captain and still ranks third on SU's career scoring list with 71 points. He averaged 1.25 points per game during his career, the third-best mark in school history. Gervais competed for the Orange from 1997-1999 and was a two-time All-BIG EAST First Team honoree. He also earned NSCAA All-Region first-team accolades in 1999 and second-team all-region honors in 1998.

SYRACUSE TAMES SWASHBUCKLING PIRATES

Syracuse's 2-1 victory against Seton Hall on Friday, Sept. 7 at the Mayor's Cup was its first against the Pirates since the 1999 season. The triumph ended the Pirates' six-match series unbeaten streak against the Orange. Seton Hall held a 4-0-2 advantage in the six meetings prior to Friday's contest. The triumph was also the first road or neutral site win against Seton Hall in school history. The Orange's three previous wins against the Pirates came in Syracuse.

OFFENSE EXPLODES VERSUS PENN STATE

Syracuse tallied four goals in its season-opening win against Penn State on Aug. 31. It was the most goals for the Orange since it netted four scores in a 4-0 shutout of Cornell on Oct. 22, 2003. The four tallies represented the most for Syracuse in a season-opening game under head coach **Dean Foti**, who took over the team in 1991. The Orange recorded a 5-1 victory in the 1990 campaign starter against Oneonta under former coach Tim Hankinson.

LANDMARK WIN

Syracuse's 2007 season-opener against Penn State marked the first time the Orange squared off against a Big Ten opponent since it played Ohio State in 1997 at the New England Ford Dealers Soccer Classic in Storrs, Conn. Its victory against the Nittany Lions was SU's first against a current Big Ten member since it defeated Penn State, 2-1, in 1932.



CAVICCHIA TIED FOR SECOND IN THE LEAGUE IN SAVES

Junior keeper **Robert Cavicchia** (North York, Ontario) is tied for second in the BIG EAST with 58 saves on the season. He stopped at least five shots for the eighth time this year versus Cincinnati on Oct. 13. Cavicchia ranks sixth all-time at SU in saves with 205.

Cavicchia is already one of the most accomplished netminders in school history and he continues to climb the SU career charts in several categories (see right). Cavicchia has appeared in 12 of SU's 13 matches in 2007, missing the season-opener against Penn State because he was recovering from a hip injury. He combined for 10 saves against Pittsburgh and West Virginia to move past Alim Karim for sixth on the Orange's career list and he is currently 24 stops behind legendary Orange goalie Joe Papaleo for fifth. He owns a career 1.09 goals-against average, which ranks fourth in school history.

THREE NAMED TO WOLSTEIN CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

The Orange placed three players on the Wolstein Classic All-Tournament Team. Sophomore forward **Hansen Woodruff** (Stuart, Fla.) was named to the squad after having a hand in three of SU's four goals in its thrashing of Penn State. Woodruff assisted on both of the Orange's first-half tallies, including junior **Spencer Schomaker's** (Seattle, Wash.) game-winner. It was the first multi-assist game of Woodruff's career. He also netted an unassisted score in the 53rd minute to seal the Orange's season-opening victory.

In addition to Woodruff, senior defender **Brad Peetoom** (Abbotsford, British Columbia) and junior backline mate **Karol Wasielewski** (Gdynia, Poland) were also picked to the all-tournament squad. The duo teamed up for SU's fourth goal against the Nittany Lions when Wasielewski headed in a rebounded shot by Peetoom in the 68th minute. The goal was the first for Wasielewski and came in his first collegiate match. As center backs, the pair also organized SU's defense, which did not surrender a goal in 200 minutes of action.

COMPELLED TO HIRE CUPELLO

Orange head coach **Dean Foti** completed his coaching staff in July with the addition of assistant coach **Tim Cupello**. Cupello will assist Foti in all aspects of the program and comes to Syracuse after a successful two-year stint at his alma mater, Fredonia State. During his two seasons with the Blue Devils, Cupello helped guide the team to a 29-11-6 overall record and a 13-4-1 conference mark. In 2005, Fredonia completed the campaign with a 17-4-4 record and was 15th in the final NSCAA Division III rankings after losing to eventual national runner-up Gustavus Adolphus in the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals. In 2006, the Blue Devils returned to the postseason and won the ECAC Upstate Championship, finishing the year with a 12-7-2 record.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Orange has posted a winning record at the SU Soccer Stadium in nine of its first 11 seasons at the facility. SU went 6-4-2 at home in 2005, matching the team season record for wins at the stadium and was 5-4 there in 2006. So far the Orange is 3-1-0 at the facility in 2007. The Orange has won six contests at the Soccer Stadium three times (1996, 1998, 2005) and owns an overall SU Soccer Stadium record of 54-39-7. The team recorded its 50th Soccer Stadium victory against Hartwick on Oct. 10, 2006.

Prior to the opening of the building, the Orange played its home games at Coyne Field and the Carrier Dome. During the Orange's magical run to the 1982 BIG EAST title it won a school-record nine home contests, going 3-0 at Coyne Field and 6-2 in the friendly confines of the Dome. The Orange is 149-71-21 since 1980 in games contested in Syracuse.

THE MAGIC NUMBER

Syracuse has scored at least three goals in a game twice in 2007. The Orange put up four in its season-opening victory against Penn State and scored three in its shutout of Fordham in its home opener. Syracuse's victory against the Rams improved the Orange's all-time record when scoring three-or-more goals to 205-15-17, including 22 straight victories in games when it scores at least three times. The last time SU lost when registering at least three goals came on Oct. 18, 1998 when the Orange lost at #11 Georgetown, 5-4, in overtime.

Dean FOTI

17th Year • 129-146-30 • Syracuse, 1983

Syracuse head coach **Dean Foti** has accumulated more wins than any other Orange soccer coach in his 16-plus seasons on the sideline. Foti has a school-record 129 victories, including four seasons of at least 10 triumphs, and 11 wins versus ranked opponents since 1997.

Foti owns the second-longest coaching tenure in the history of Orange soccer behind Arthur Horrocks' 22-year stint as the SU mentor.

Foti has guided the Orange to a top-25 ranking in four of the last seven seasons and the Orange has at least one win versus a ranked team in seven of the last nine campaigns. Foti and the Orange were ranked as high as 18th during the 2001 season, the second straight year his squad was among the nation's top 20.

SUCCESS AFTER SYRACUSE

Foti's student-athletes have found professional soccer success after Syracuse. Chris Aloisi, captain of the 2003 team, was drafted by the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and was a member of the Houston Dynamo during its run to the 2006 MLS title.

Richard Asante, an All-BIG EAST and All-Northeast Region selection in 2006, became the latest member of the Orange to be selected in the MLS SuperDraft. He was taken with the first pick in the third round (27th overall) by Toronto FC.

In addition, the Orange has had a player selected in the USL First Division College Draft in eight of the last 10 years, including 2006 when Ezra Prendergast was chosen by the Rochester Raging Rhinos. Prendergast was also picked in the MLS Supplemental Draft by the Chicago Fire. Syracuse has also had players compete in the NPSL, WISL and USISL.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Foti has coached 34 student-athletes to All-BIG EAST honors in his 16 seasons, including eight first-team selections. Two players have been named the conference's Rookie of the Year during his tenure, including 2001 winner Jarett Park. Park led the nation in assists and was named national Freshman of the Year by *Soccer America*. Foti's players have also been recognized as some of the best in the region. Twenty-nine of his charges have received All-New York or All-Northeast Region honors, including 14 first-teamers.

Foti coached the 2000 Orange to its first top-25 ranking since 1997 after Syracuse upset top-ranked, and eventual national champion Connecticut on the road. Foti and the Orange made their second consecutive BIG EAST Tournament appearance that season, a first for the program since 1995 and 1996. In 2005, he guided SU to the conference tournament for the fifth time. On its way, the Orange knocked off a pair of ranked league opponents in USF and Cincinnati.

The 1999 NSCAA/adidas New York Region Coach of the Year, Foti led the Orange to 11 wins that season, the highest single-season total in his tenure. The squad finished the year ranked second in the region, boasting wins versus a pair of top-25 teams.

FOTI IS SYRACUSE SOCCER

Even before his tenure on the sidelines began, Foti was a part of Syracuse soccer history. A four-year starter from 1979-82, Foti captained the squad during his junior and senior seasons, leading the Orange to the inaugural BIG EAST Tournament title and a school-record 16 wins. He is one of just 18 SU players to wear the captain's armband for more than one season.

Prior to returning to Syracuse, Foti spent six years as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland. He was an integral part of the staff that led the Terrapins from a dormant ACC program to an NCAA Tournament team in 1986. Foti also was a graduate assistant at Syracuse in 1984 and an assistant at Fayetteville-Manlius High School (N.Y.) in 1983 before joining the Maryland staff.

GROWING THE GAME

In addition to his duties with the Orange, Foti is an experienced clinician. He served on the Olympic Development Program (ODP) Region I staff and has served on the USSF National Coaching School's staff. He also worked on the ODP staffs of both New York West and Maryland. Foti spent 12 years as the assistant coach of the U-17 Region I Olympic Development Team. His squads traveled the globe, playing in tournaments in France (1996-97, 2004, 2006), Brazil (1998, 2003), Switzerland (1999), Morocco (2000), Spain (2002), and England (2004).

Foti is also a member of several coaching organizations. He was the vice president of The BIG EAST Conference Men's Soccer Coaches Association in 2006-07 and served as the organization's president from 1996-98. He was a member of the NSCAA Regional Ratings Committee (N.Y.) from 1993-98, serving as chairman in 1994 and 1995. In addition, he served three terms on the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee for the Division I Men's Soccer Championship (1992-94, 1998-2000, and 2004-05).

Foti has been involved in youth soccer, directing summer camps for 22 years. After co-directing the 1985 Syracuse Soccer Camp, he successfully started and directed the University of Maryland camp from 1986-90. Since 1991, Foti has run the popular SU Boys Soccer Camp and in 2007 directed a six-week spring training camp for the first time.

PERSONAL

Foti graduated from Syracuse in 1983 and received his master's degree in physical education from SU in 1985. He holds both a USSF "A" license and a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

Foti, a native of Oneonta, N.Y., and his wife, Holly, have three daughters -- Riley, and twins, Sophia and Lainey. The Fotis reside in Syracuse.
