SYRACUSE FACES TOP-SEEDED NORTHWESTERN

The seventh-ranked Orange continues its quest for the NCAA Championship as it squares off against top-seeded Northwestern in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Syracuse, who has won 11 of its last 13 games, defeated eight-seed Vanderbilt, 16-10, in the First Round. Northwestern is riding an 18-game winning streak and defeated Holy Cross, 19-7, in the First Round.

ORANGE WINS FIRST NCAA GAME IN SIXTH APPEARANCE

Syracuse won its first-ever NCAA Tournament game against Vanderbilt in the First Round. The Orange is making its sixth trip to the NCAA Championship and its first with an automatic bid. The Orange earned the BIG EAST's bid by winning the inaugural BIG EAST Tournament. Syracuse received at-large selections in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2005.

REMARKABLE ROWAN

Sophomore **Katie Rowan** is rewriting the Syracuse record books in just her second season at SU. She has set school records with 83 points and 58 goals in 2007, breaking the marks set by Leigh-Ann Zimmer in 2004. Zimmer totaled 74 points in 2004 on 52 goals and 22 assists.

Rowan is not shy to setting school records. During her first season on The Hill, Rowan totaled 46 goals and 56 points, setting freshman records. In addition, she matched school records with a seven-goal and 10-point performance against Rutgers earlier in the season.

Rowan has scored at least one goal in each game this season. Only two other players have accomplished that feat at Syracuse. (Zimmer, 2002, 2004; **Gaddy Fortune**, 2006). Rowan has tallied at least a hat trick in SU's last 11 games.

Rowan is not only among the best at Syracuse, but she also ranks highly in the nation. She currently stands third in the BIG EAST and seventh in the nation with 4.61 points per game, third in the conference and 10th in the NCAA with 3.22 goals per game and third in the BIG EAST with 1.39 assists per game.

In just her second season with the Orange, Rowan already ranks as one of the best offensive players in the program's history. She currently stands fifth in school history with 139 career points, fifth with 104 career goals and sixth with 35 career assists.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Top-ranked Northwestern defeated eighth-ranked Syracuse on March 30. The Wildcats scored the final two goals of the first half and the opening three goals of the second half to turn a 3-3 game into an 8-3 advantage. Sophomore **Katie Rowan** tallied three goals and added an assist, while Aly Josephs led the Wildcats with three goals. The three-goal difference was Northwestern's closest game during its 18-game winning streak.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

Northwestern has won its last 18 games and defeated Holy Cross, 19-7, during the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats scored the first six goals of the game and never looked back. Three different Northwestern players tallied hat tricks to lead the Wildcats' offense

Sophomore **Hannah Nielson** leads the team with 110 points on 47 goals and 63 assists. Junior **Hilary Bowen** is second with 83 points (50 goals and 33 assists) and senior **Kristen Kjellman** has also posted 83 points on a team-best 60 goals and 23 assists. Sophomore **Meredith Frank** (54g, 16a) and senior **Aly Josephs** (42g, 3a) have also been a force on offense this season. Kjellman and Nielson are two of the five finalists for the Tewaaraton Trophy.

Sophomore **Morgan Lathrop** anchors the Northwestern defense, which ranks number one in the NCAA. Lathrop leads the country with a goals against average of 5.55 and a save percentage of .595.

GROUND GAME

Senior **Jill DePetris** is making her mark in the Syracuse career record books. DePetris, who has started all 66 of her games at Syracuse, has amassed 142 ground balls during her career on The Hill. Her 142 ground balls ranks third in the Syracuse record book and is just two ground balls shy of Kim Wayne's school record. Wayne totaled 144 ground balls from 2000 to 2003.

During the 2005 season, DePetris led the Orange with 56 ground balls, matching a school record. Stacey Brown also registered 56 ground balls during the 2000 season. DePetris also led the BIG EAST and ranked 15th in the NCAA with 3.56 ground balls per game.

In addition to her ground ball dominance, DePetris ranks among the best at Syracuse in scoring. Against Harvard, she became the eighth player in school history to post 100 career points. She currently ranks seventh in the program's history with 124 career points, third with 59 career assists and ninth with 65 career goals.

BIG EAST CHAMPIONS

The Orange won the inaugural BIG EAST Women's Lacrosse Championship with a 12-7 victory against top-seeded Georgetown on Sunday, April 27. Sophomore goalkeeper **Amber Pardee-Hill** recorded 13 saves in the contest, earning the championship's Most Outstanding Player award. With the victory, Syracuse earned the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.

The BIG EAST title was not only the first for the Orange and ended Georgetown's six-year reign as the conference's champions, but it was also SU's first-ever victory against the Hoyas in 11 attempts.

LAST TIME OUT

The Syracuse Orange women's lacrosse team won its first-ever NCAA Tournament game, defeating eighth-seeded Vanderbilt, 16-10, in Nashville. The Orange also won its school-record 13th game of the season.

Sophomore **Katie Rowan** tallied a game-high five goals to become the sixth player in school history to surpass the 100-goal plateau. Rowan reached the mark in just 34 games, becoming the fastest player and first sophomore in school history to post 100 career goals. Leigh-Ann Zimmer held the previous mark of 40 games. In addition, Rowan raised her single-season school records to 83 points and 58 goals.

Freshman **Christina Dove** also scored five goals and added an assist to record a team-best six points in her postseason debut. Senior **Ashley Pike** scored three goals, while senior **Melissa Pearsall**, junior **Kristin Brady** and freshman **Halley Quillinan** added a goal to round out the scoring for Syracuse. Brady also led the team with two assists and seven draw controls, while freshman **Lindsay Rogers** matched a career high with four draw controls.

Sophomore goalkeeper **Amber Pardee-Hill** stopped seven shots in the cage. Junior **Christina Gibson** paced the SU defense with a team-best two caused turnovers.

Vanderbilt started the game strong, scoring just 34 seconds into the contest. The Commodores added another goal with 25:25 remaining to grab a 2-0 advantage. Dove got the Orange on board with a free-position goal with 21:24 remaining and after Vanderbilt responded with a goal of its own, Dove capped a 3-0 SU run with her second score of the afternoon.

The Commodores responded with a goal to tie the game at four, but the Orange recorded the next two scores to take the lead for good. Rowan and Pike each tallied goals to give the Orange a two-goal advantage. The two schools then traded a pair of goals as Syracuse headed into intermission with an 8-6 advantage.

The Orange came out firing in the second half as Dove notched her fourth goal of the afternoon 54 seconds in to the second stanza. Vanderbilt responded with the next two goals to pull within one, 9-8, but Quillinan tallied her first goal of day as the Orange regained a two-goal advantage. The teams traded a pair of goals and then Dove, Pike, Pearsall and Brady each notched a goal to give SU the six-goal margin of victory, 16-10.

The Orange, which lost the battle in draw circle 32-9 during the last two games, held a 17-11 advantage in draw controls against the Commodores. Syracuse also outshot Vanderbilt, 30-22.

MILLER NAMED BIG EAST COACH OF THE YEAR; SCHOOL RECORD SIX EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

Syracuse head coach **Lisa Miller** was honored among her peers, earning BIG EAST Coach of the Year accolades at the season-ending awards banquet.

In addition, a school-record six student-athletes earned all-conference honors. Freshman **Halley Quillinan** and sophomore **Katie Rowan** were both named to the All-BIG EAST First Team and seniors **Jill DePetris**, **Ashley Pike** and **Chelsea Strodel** and junior **Bridget Looney** each earned second-team honors. Syracuse's six selections to the all-conference teams are the most of any school in the conference.

The head coach at Syracuse since its inception in 1998, Miller guided the Orange to its 100th victory earlier in the season. She owns a career record of 103-51 and has led SU to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA invitations and the 1999 ECAC Championship. The 1999 North Region Coach of the Year, Miller picked up her first BIG EAST Coach of the Year honor.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The Orange receives a lot of its scoring from its younger classes. Currently, the Class of 2010 is the highest scoring class at Syracuse, accounting for 36.6 percent of SU's goals and 32.0 percent of its points.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The SU defense has stepped up big lately and it led the Orange to its first-ever conference championship. The Orange allowed only 14 goals in its two games during the BIG EAST Tournament and was led by sophomore goalkeeper **Amber Pardee-Hill**, who was named the championship's Most Outstanding Player. She recorded 24 saves during the weekend for a save percentage of .632. Against the Hoyas in the championship game, Pardee-Hill recorded 13 saves, including nine in the first half to lead SU to a five-goal intermission advantage. In addition to being named the championship's Most Outstanding Player, Pardee-Hill also picked up WomensLax.com Player of the Week honors.

Pardee-Hill's game has improved a great amount during the second-half of the season. During the last six games, she is averaging 11.50 saves per game and owns a goal against average of 8.80 and a save percentage of .571.

With her improved play, Pardee-Hill leads the BIG EAST in goal against average (9.33), save percentage (.514) and saves per game (10.00). She also ranks 12th in the country in save percentage and 13th in goals against average.

DISRUPTIVE PRESENCE

Junior **Bridget Looney** is forcing opposing players to turn the ball over at an alarming rate. Against Colgate, Looney set an SU record by forcing eight opponent miscues. Carrie Soultz (at New Hampshire, 1999) and Jessica Trombley (at Stanford, 2002) shared the previous record of six.

Looney also set the single-season record for caused turnovers. With her two forced miscues against Rutgers, Looney topped the previous record of 29 caused turnovers, set by Carrie Bolduc in 1999. She has totaled 32 caused turnovers so far in 2007. Looney currently ranks second in the BIG EAST and ranks 16th nationally with 1.88 caused turnovers per game.

OFFENSE IS KEY IN VICTORY

Syracuse has been unstoppable during its victories this season. The Orange has averaged 18.3 goals during its 13 victories this season and has scored at least 12 times in each win.

On the reverse side, Syracuse is averaging 8.2 goals in its five defeats during the 2007 season and has yet to score more than 10 goals in any loss. The Orange ranks second in the country in scoring offense, averaging 15.31 goals per game.

DEFENSE BECOMING A FORCE TO RECKON WITH

The Syracuse defensive unit is joining the offense as one of the dominant forces in the NCAA. After struggling throughout the beginning of the season, the SU defense has turned things around and has led the Orange to victory. During the first 10 games of the season, the Orange were giving up 10.10 goals per game but in its last seven games, the SU defense has allowed nearly 1.5 less goals per game, giving up just 8.63 goals per game. The defense led Syracuse to the BIG EAST Championship, allowing only seven goals in both games.

Syracuse currently ranks 13th in the country in scoring defense, allowing 9.33 goals per game.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Syracuse is doing a much better job of passing the ball around to create scoring opportunities this year. The Orange has recorded assists on 39.1 percent (109-of-279) of its goals in 2007, compared to just 29.5 percent in 2006 (56-of-190). Syracuse currently ranks third in the BIG EAST with 6.06 assists per game after finishing fourth in the conference during the 2006 season with 3.44 assists per game.

In addition, **Gaddy Fortune** and **Katie Rowan** combined for 48.9 percent (93-of-190) of Syracuse's goals in 2006. This year the scoring is much more spread out with five players posting at least 48 points. Syracuse is one of two teams in the country to have four different players score at least 40 goals this season (Northwestern is the other).

MAGIC NUMBER 10

The number 10 is a key number for the Orange women's lacrosse team. Syracuse is 21-4 over the past two seasons when scoring at least 10 goals in a game. Meanwhile, SU has won only one of nine games when they failed to score at least 10 goals.

On the opposite end, Syracuse is 15-3 in the past two seasons when allowing fewer than 10 goals in a game. When the Orange allows more than 10 goals, Syracuse is 7-9.

The number 10 is also key to the postseason. The Orange has earned a postseason spot every year it has won 10 or more games. Syracuse won the ECAC Championship in 1999 after completing a 10-4 regular season. SU then earned NCAA Championship invitations in 2000 (12-3), 2001 (10-4), 2002 (10-5), 2003 (10-5) and 2005 (12-4) after winning 10 or more regular season games.

Syracuse won nine games in all three of the seasons it did not qualify for postseason play. Syracuse went 9-4 in 1998, 9-6 in 2004 and 9-7 last season.

HALFTIME ADVANTAGE

If an opposing team is making halftime adjustments to try and rally to beat the Orange, they rarely work. Over the past two seasons, Syracuse is 19-2 when leading at halftime, including 12-1 during the 2007 season. SU's only losses during the stretch were against Penn the last two seasons.

However, Syracuse has rallied only once from a halftime deficit during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Syracuse's come-from-behind win against Connecticut was the only time that SU won in nine tries when trailing at intermission. The Orange is 2-2 the past two seasons when tied at intermission.

RECORD-SETTING OFFENSE

The Orange offense is rolling past opponents and is rewriting the Syracuse record books in the process. Syracuse has already set the school single-season record for goals in a season, scoring 279 goals in 18 games. The 2005 team held the previous record, scoring 205 goals in 17 games. Syracuse has at least one game remaining on its schedule to add to its record.

The Orange is also dominating the BIG EAST leaderboard. Four of the top 10 scorers in the conference play at Syracuse. **Katie Rowan** has led the charge, ranking third with 4.61 points per game. **Christina Dove**, **Ashley Pike** and **Halley Quillinan** also rank in the top 10.

DEFENSE STEPS UP WHEN NEEDED

Syracuse's defensive unit has been a very clutch unit all season long and it was very evident during its victory against sixth-ranked Notre Dame. Despite giving up its second-most goals of the season, the defense stepped up its game when the time came and helped lead the Orange to a win. SU did not allow a single shot in the final 11:38 of the game as the Orange turned a 13-12 deficit into a 16-13 victory.

MOVIN' ON UP

The Orange has consistently moved up the rankings in both the coaches poll and *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll. Syracuse has gained at least five spots in both poll since the preseason rankings. The Orange is No. 7 in the coaches poll after starting the season at No. 15 and has moved from No. 17 in the media poll to No. 7. Syracuse's No. 7 ranking matches the highest that the Orange has been ranked in school history.

CLOSE IN DEFEAT, NOT IN VICTORY

The Orange has lost five games in 2007 by a combined nine goals (1.8 goals average margin of defeat). All four of SU's defeats have come to top-10 teams. On the opposite end, Syracuse's victories have not been close. The Orange has won its 12 games by an average of 8.92 goals per game. The Orange currently ranks fifth in the country with a 6.06 average scoring margin.

BEASTS OF THE BIG EAST

Syracuse is dominating the statistics among BIG EAST schools. As of May 14, the Orange is the best offensive team and defensive team in the conference. Syracuse leads the BIG EAST in goals per game (15.50) and goals against average (9.33). The Orange also ranks first in several other categories in the conference, including points per game (21.56), draw controls per game (13.61), shots per game (35.06), shots on goal per game (25.50), turnovers per game (12.33), caused turnovers per game (10.17), saves per game (10.00) and save percentage (.514). Syracuse also ranks in the top half of the conference in assists per game (6.06) and ground balls per game (17.22).

The BIG EAST ranks as one of the toughest conferences in the country. Five of the six teams in the conference are ranked. No. 8 Georgetown, No. 13 Notre Dame, No. 14 Rutgers, and No. 20 Connecticut join Syracuse in the top 20 of the coaches poll.

WEEK OF HONORS

Three different SU players earned national player of the week accolades following their performances in Syracuse's victories against Towson and sixth-ranked Notre Dame. Senior **Ashley Pike** was named the *Inside Lacrosse* Player of the Week. She totaled nine goals, including a career-best five scores against Notre Dame. Pike was also named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week.

Senior **Chelsea Strodel** earned WomensLacrosse.com Player of the Week honors for her performance against the Fighting Irish. Strodel forced three turnovers in the first half and then switched to cover Notre Dame's leading scorer in the second half, holding her without a point. Strodel also helped anchor a defense that did not allow a shot over the final 11 minutes of action as SU turned a 13-12 deficit into a 16-13 victory. In addition, Strodel earned BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

Junior **Bridget Looney** was the third Syracuse student-athlete honored, earning WomensLax.com Player of the Week accolades. Looney scored a career-best four goals against the Irish, including two of SU's final four scores.

ROWAN FASTEST TO 100 CAREER POINTS AND GOALS

In her record-setting performance against Rutgers, sophomore **Katie Rowan** also became the ninth player in school history to post 100 career points. She reached the 100-point plateau in just 28 games, tying her with Katrina Hable as the quickest SU players to accomplish the feat.

In SU's first-ever postseason victory, Rowan tallied five goals and in the process became the sixth and fastest player in school history to reach 100 career goals. Rowan, who was the first sophomore in SU history to post her 100th career goal, reached the plateau in just 34 games. Leigh-Ann Zimmer was previously the quickest to reach 100 goals, eclipsing the mark in 40 games.

Rowan ranks among the best in SU's career record book. She ranks fifth with 139 career points, fifth with 104 career goals and sixth with 35 career assists.

BETHLEHEM DISCIPLES

Bethlehem Central High School continues to send people to the Syracuse women's lacrosse team. Assistant coach **John Battaglino** was the first member of the Bethlehem program to make his way to the Salt City, joining the Orange for the 2005 season. A six-time High School Coach of the Year honoree by US Lacrosse, Battaglino is in his third season with Syracuse.

Sophomore **Katie Rowan** followed Battaglino the following year, joining the Orange for the 2006 season. A two-time All-American at Bethlehem, Rowan set Syracuse freshman records for goals (46) and points (56) during her rookie season. She has set single-season SU records with 83 points and 58 goals in 2007. Rowan also ranks fifth in school history with 139 career points, fifth with 104 career goals and sixth with 35 career assists.

Freshman **Halley Quillinan** is the third member of the Bethlehem Central team to make a move to the Syracuse program. Quillinan earned All-America accolades three times during her high school career. Quillinan is second on the team and has topped Rowan's freshman record with 47 goals.

Currently, 14 of Battaglino's former players are competing at the Division I level.

SISTER ACT

Senior **Jill DePetris** is joined by a familiar face this year, freshman and sister **Jackie DePetris**. Jill ranks among the best at Syracuse. She has started all 66 games she has played in and ranks seventh in school history with 124 career points, third with 59 career assists and ninth with 65 career goals. Jackie has posted two goals in four games during her freshman season.

Jill and Jackie's older sister, Jen, also played lacrosse at the college level. Jen finished her career at Monmouth last season.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

Syracuse has tied the school record for most goals in a single game twice this year. The Orange first matched the record against Binghamton on March 6, winning 23-4. SU duplicated the feat against Harvard on March 25, winning 23-12. Syracuse also scored 23 goals against Albany during the 1998 season, defeating the Great Danes, 23-4.

Against the Bearcats, the Orange also posted its second-largest margin of victory, winning by 19 goals. Syracuse defeated Connecticut by 20 goals in 1998, 20-0. Thirteen different players scored for Syracuse in its record-setting performance. Junior **Kristin Brady** and sophomore **Megan Mosenson** led the Orange with three goals each.

Less than a month later, the Orange once again posted 23 goals against Harvard. The game's 35 combined goals also matched a school record, tying the mark set against Maryland in 2000 (Maryland won, 24-11). The Orange were led by freshman **Halley Quillinan**, who recorded five goals and two assists for seven points, the eighth-highest total in SU history.

The Orange has recorded five its top six scoring games during the 2007 season. In addition to the games against Binghamton and Harvard, the Orange scored 22 goals against Cornell and 21 goals against Rutgers and Loyola in three-consecutive games.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

The freshmen duo of **Christina Dove** and **Halley Quillinan** is proving to be very beneficial for the Orange this season. The two have combined to score 94 goals and 112 points during their rookie campaigns.

Each have scored 47 goals in 2007, breaking the freshman scoring record. **Katie Rowan** totaled 46 during her freshman season in 2006. The 47 goals are also tied for the third-most in school history. In addition, Dove has also recorded 58 total points, setting the freshman points mark. Rowan's 56 points last season was the previous record. Dove's 58 points are also the third-most in school history, while Quillinan's 54 points are tied for ninth in the program's history.

WINNING NO. 100

With its victory over Colgate, the Orange won its 100th game in the program's history. Head coach **Lisa Miller** has guided the Orange during all 100 of its victories.

The Orange won its 100th game in just its 10th season of play. Syracuse completed the feat in 151 games (.662 winning percentage) as SU has enjoyed one of the most successful tenures during the past 10 seasons. Syracuse has posted a winning season each of its first nine years and has qualified for postseason action six times. SU's nine-consecutive winning seasons is the sixth-longest string in the history of the NCAA.

COMEBACK KIDS

Syracuse's comeback victory against Connecticut was one of the greatest rallies in school history. The Orange trailed by as many as four goals in the second half and by as much as three goals with under five minutes remaining before rallying for the victory.

Syracuse trailed, 15-12, before making its comeback. **Ashley Pike** scored with 4:34 left and **Christina Dove** pulled the Orange within one with 2:32 remaining. The Orange won the ensuing draw control and after SU recorded two shots off target, Connecticut's goalkeeper stopped Pike's shot with one minute remaining. The Huskies attempted to clear the ball but **Halley Quillinan** forced a turnover with 35 seconds remaining, leading to **Kristin Brady's** first goal of the day with 27 seconds left to send the game to overtime. Brady would score two more goals in the extra session to lead the Orange to the 18-16 victory.

The comeback against the Huskies matched the second-greatest comeback in school history (Virginia, 2004). The Orange trailed Boston University, 8-2, in 1999 before rallying to win, 10-9. SU's three-goal comeback in the final five minutes also tied the largest rally in school history (Virginia, 2003). Brady's goal with 27 seconds remaining was the third-latest regulation SU goal that tied or won a game.

MILLER NAMED CANADIAN NATIONAL TEAM COACH

The Canadian Lacrosse Association and Women's National Team Program has announced that Syracuse head coach **Lisa Miller** has been appointed head coach for the national team. Miller will lead Canada at the IFWLA World Cup in Prague, Czech Republic in 2009.

Miller served as an assistant coach for Canada's 2001 World Cup team. At the World Cup, Canada lost in the bronze-medal game to the host-country, England.

Lisa Miller started the Syracuse women's lacrosse program and has brought it to national prominence. One of the most successful coaches in NCAA history, Miller ranks 10th among active coaches with a .664 winning percentage. In her nine seasons at the helm, the Orange has posted a winning season each year, claimed an ECAC Championship title and made five NCAA Tournament appearances. Syracuse's string of consecutive winning seasons is the sixth-longest streak in NCAA history and the fifth-longest active streak.

National Recognition at SU

During her tenure at Syracuse, women's lacrosse student-athletes have been among the most decorated players on The Hill. In 2006, junior Gaddy Fortune became the ninth player in the program's history to garner Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) All-America accolades. Miller has mentored at least one All-American in each of the past eight seasons for a total of 14 awards.

The 2006 postseason honors did not end with Fortune's All-America nod. Fortune and freshman Katie Rowan were selected as first-team regional All-Americans, while Stephanie Bissett earned second-team accolades. The three regional standouts were joined by Kristin Brady and Chelsea Strodel on the All-BIG EAST team, with Fortune and Rowan earning unanimous selection. Miller has coached 16 regional All-Americans who have earned 26 awards during her nine-year tenure and 18 All-BIG EAST selections a combined 27 times during the six years of the conference.

In 2005, Miller guided Syracuse to the postseason for the sixth time in seven seasons as the Orange earned its fifth invitation to the NCAA Tournament. Syracuse was edged by Dartmouth, 9-8, in the first round.

During the 2004 season, Miller led Leigh-Ann Zimmer to national prominence, helping Zimmer earn first-team All-America accolades. Zimmer, who also earned BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year honors, joined Stacey Brown as Orange first-team All-Americans. Brown was recognized in 2001. Zimmer was also the second SU student-athlete to be named BIG EAST Player of the Year. Carrie Soultis received Midfield of the Year honors in the conference's inaugural season in 2001.

The Orange qualified for the NCAA Tournament in four consecutive seasons from 2000 to 2003 under Miller's leadership. During those four seasons, Syracuse competed on the field with great success, posting nine victories against ranked opponents.

Miller led the Orange to a perfect 2-0 record in the team's first postseason appearance in 1999, winning the ECAC Championship title. For her efforts, she was named the North Region's Coach of the Year by the IWLCA and was one of three finalists for the Division I National Coach of the Year Award.

In the program's first year in 1998, Syracuse finished the season with a 9-4 record and possessed the most potent offense in the country, leading the nation in scoring with a 15.08 goals-per-game average. The Orange ranked first in the NCAA in scoring margin, outscoring opponents by an average of 7.3 goals.

Miller's student-athletes not only excel on the field, but they perform in the classroom as well. In 2005, the team was recognized as an IWLCA Academic Squad by achieving a GPA of over 3.0. Miller has also guided three student-athletes to CoSIDA Academic All-District honors and Carrie Soultis became the first person in the program's history to earn Academic All-America honors in 2002.

Off the Field Positions

Along with her coaching prowess, Miller has done a lot to advance the sport of lacrosse. She serves as the chair of the NCAA regional committee and is serving her second term on the NCAA selection committee. Miller also is the current chair of the IWLCA Academic All-America committee and served on the Tewaaraton selection committee from 2004 through 2006. The Tewaaraton Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate player.

All-American Player

As a player at the College of William & Mary, one of the top women's programs in the country, Miller left her mark. She was captain of her team, the 1987 Outstanding Female Senior Athlete and an All-American. She still ranks third on the William & Mary all-time scoring list and fifth on its career points list with 145. She was also a member of the U.S. Lacrosse Team as a senior.

In March of 2004, Miller became only the third women's lacrosse player at William & Mary to be inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame.

International Experience

In January of 2007, Miller was named the Canadian National Team Head Coach after serving as an assistant coach for the Canadian team in 2001. At the World Cup, held in England, Miller's team lost to the host country in the bronze-medal game.

As a player, Miller continued to compete for the U.S. after college, finishing her playing career as an alternate on the 1989 World Cup Team.
